

How to Securely Lock Your Bike

Find a **secured bike rack or pole** to lock your bike on. Be sure to avoid locking your bike on things that can be easily ripped out of the ground.



Attached the U-lock to the rack **through the** rear triangle of your bike and rim of the rear wheel. A second lock provides an additional layer of security.



Never rely on a cable lock

Cable locks can be defeated easily in minutes with inexpensive tools. Over 40% of outdoor bicycle theft is a result of defeated cable locks. Never rely on a cable lock as your primary lock.

Preventing Bike Theft

To help protect your bike from theft, always securely lock it. Here's a detailed breakdown of practical tips to keep your bike safe.



Prioritize Security with Locks

Invest in a good lock

A high-quality lock is your first line of defense. Consider a U-lock or a strong chain lock.

Double lock

Using two different types of locks (e.g., U-lock and a chain lock) makes it harder for thieves to steal your bike.

Lock the frame and both wheels

Secure the frame and both wheels to a fixed object. This makes it harder for thieves to simply pick up and carry away your bike.

Secure it as close to the stand as possible

This gives thieves little or no room to maneuver.



Registration and Identification

Register your bike

Registering your bike with a local bike registration program or online database helps identify your bike if stolen and assists police in finding it.

Engrave your bike

Engrave your bike's frame with your name or a unique identifier to deter thieves and make it harder to resell.



Know The Serial Number

You should know your bike's serial number. The serial number of your bike will be helpful information if your bike is stolen.

Write it down or take a picture of it.



Parking and Storage

Park in secure locations

Choose bike racks in well-lit, high-traffic areas where there are more people around.

Don't leave your bike in the dark

If possible, bring your bike inside at night, or park it in a well-lit area.

Take removable parts with you

If you're parking for an extended period, consider taking removable parts like the seat, lights, or wheels with you.



Bike Insurance

Consider bike insurance

Bike insurance can provide financial protection in case of theft or damage.



Report Theft Immediately

Report a missing or stolen bike

If your bike is stolen, contact the police and the bike registration program as soon as possible.
